53	<p><u>Eisteddfod</u></p> <p>Projects and Events Manager Mrs RC summarised the report. Councillors present agreed it went well and passed on congratulations to all who entered.</p> <p><u>Recommended:</u> The information be noted.</p>	
54	<p><u>Photo comp</u></p> <p>RC summarised the report. Councillors present agreed it went well and passed on congratulations to all who entered.</p> <p>Following discussion it was suggested that keeping the application period open longer allowed for better interest, and this timescale should be considered again for the 2023 competition.</p> <p><u>Recommended:</u> The information be noted and longer competition running times be adopted for future competitions.</p>	RC/AA /MW
55	<p><u>Poetry Competition</u></p> <p>RC summarised the report and proposed dates, theme and prizes for the Poetry Competition 2023.</p> <p>Following a discussion it was noted that the dates and theme tie in well with the MHPT and other projects for the year.</p> <p><u>Recommended:</u> the proposed dates, theme of “Pontypool Park” and the prizes be agreed.</p>	RC/AA /MW

56	<p><u>King Charles III Coronation</u></p> <p><i>(Cllr Jon Horlor joined the meeting at this point)</i></p> <p>Chair of Events RM fed back on the event and its success, and also shared photos from the day. In particular, the screen was particularly popular with elderly people, and the Beefeater model was the subject of many a selfie throughout the day. There was a steady footfall throughout the day for this historic event.</p> <p>Following a discussion it was suggested that joining with other events that Pontypool Town/Pontypool Market organised was an advantageous way to save resources.</p> <p><u>Recommended:</u> supporting other local events should be considered for the future.</p>	
57	<p><u>Party in the Park</u></p> <p>RC updated councillors present on this years' Party in the park event. Bookings, H&S, Entertainment is all on track. The budget is tight, but still on track.</p> <p>Advertising is on track, with facebook advert currently running, and posters distributed. Councillors are asked to share the event with their networks.</p> <p>Banners are in production and will be installed soon.</p> <p><u>Recommended:</u> that the event details be shared by all</p>	ALL
58	<p><u>Grants Presentation Evening</u></p> <p>RC summarised the report and detailed the proposal to reformat and rename the event to better serve its purpose.</p> <p>A discussion was had about how the evening was a good opportunity to showcase those who had received grants, and perhaps hear about their work in more detail and how the money is being spent. Cllr Hunt added that an example of this could be sports teams showing their new kits which where made possible due to council funding.</p>	

	<p>A potential venue for the celebration evening was discussion, including the need for somewhere central with good parking. 59	<p><u>Environmental Quiz</u></p> <p>Projects and Events Officer Mrs AA fed back on the event. Attendance was good, with 7 schools attending.</p> <p>The winning school was Cwmffrwdoer, who also one last year and was the hosting school for 2023. 2nd place was George Street and 3rd Place Padre Pio.
